The tournament will be using chess clocks. Each player will have 10 minutes for all moves.

There will be trophies for winners in under 7, under 9, under 11 and under 13 age categories. There will be medals for the top 3 in each age category (subject to 5 in each section minimum) and trophies for the top 3 girls who do not win a trophy in any of the other categories.

Participants are asked to bring a snack for the afternoon snack break. No NUTS please.

## T&Cs

Graham Mooney, FIDE Arbiter notes, rules and some suggestions below:

- Each player should shake hands with their opponent both before and after the game.
- Whilst winning is nice, equally as important is being courteous and respectful to your opponent.
- Normal chess rules will apply with each player having 10 minutes to make all moves.
- Touch move is in operation. Should you touch your own or an opponents piece and not say "adjust" or "j'adoube" then you must move that piece or capture your opponent's piece if it is a legal move.
- Each round will last no longer than 20 minutes, with a further 5 minutes between rounds for the next draw to be made. If you finish your game early then please remain silent until all other games are complete. There will be 20 minutes for a snack break and toilet breaks can be taken in between rounds. All players will play between 6-7 different opponents over the course of the afternoon. For any players that have never played in a chess tournament before, you should not worry, as, after a few rounds, you will get used to it and the adults from the chess club are there to help you.
- The organisers have responsibility for the children in the playing hall only.
